Public Safety Updates:

• D – 4 – Javier Pagan

- No incidents on the corridor, but a lot of incidents around the area.
- Many larceny from motor vehicles (6).
- One burglary on West Newton Street near park. Victim encountered the suspect in his apartment. Victim did not lock his door to the apartment since his building's main door is locked.
- E-13 Bill Jones
 - No crimes took place on the corridor.
 - There were seven larceny from motor vehicle crimes this month. Six of the seven where from unlocked vehicles. Citizens need to take common sense pre caution and lock their vehicles.
 - Overall crime on a year to year basis is flat. With last year's lower crime rate, this is a positive result.
 - E-13 still has in place extra units in place at Jackson Square, 20 hours per day.
 - E-13 has added a BEST (Boson Emergency Service Team) member, clinician to work mental health issues.
 - New Community Service Officer (George Diaz) has been assigned to E-13.
- State Police
 - No one present at the meeting. Sergeant Romere D. Antoine has been transferred to a role in Norfolk County.
- Northeastern University

Community Updates:

- <u>April Advocacy Meeting</u>
 - We reviewed key areas that we would like to focus and advocate for. At our April meeting we have commitment from Representative Bryon Rushing to review our priorities list with the hope of him helping us with DCR. The key priorities (not in a specific order) include:

- Dave and Jennifer will attend the March 15th meeting that will be held by BTD (Boston Transportation Department) to understand changes to Columbus Avenue between Melnea Cass Boulevard and Northampton Street. The purpose of the meeting is: "This spring, the Boston Public Works Department is planning to repave Columbus Avenue from Melnea Cass Boulevard to Northampton Street. This presents an opportunity to reorganize the street and provide safety improvements for people walking, biking, and driving."
