New LED lighting – thank you to DCR!

New signs marking the entrances to the eleven community gardens designed by community volunteers and provided by DCR.

A new raised bed herb garden, developed by community partner Herbstalk, provides a new focal point along the park.

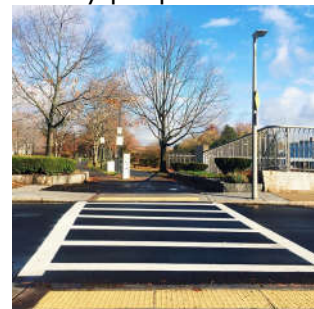
Did You Know?

PMAC meets monthly with police from the city, state, MBTA and other jurisdictions to exchange updates about public safety along the park. Police departments from three different Boston districts plus Massachusetts State Police, MBTA and university police departments serve the Southwest Corridor Park, and join together on information exchange, bicycle patrols and other safety initiatives.

100 inches of snow did not keep people indoors, and DCR staff worked tirelessly to make the SWC Park one of the best travel routes in the city.

600 responses came in to PMAC's online survey on bicycle-pedestrian path issues. This strong response demonstrates the importance of the Southwest Corridor Park to the many people who use it for walking, jogging, bicycling and more.

Our bicycle-pedestrian path ad hoc committee looked at strategies for promoting safety and a culture of courtesy and civility on the SWC path, and is working with DCR and City of Boston officials on next steps.



1,500 hours of gardening and landscaping in the park through the Southwest Corridor Park Conservancy (SWCPC). These hours reflect the work of volunteers on **eighteen** volunteer days plus over 800 hours from neighbors working on their own and in small groups throughout the week.

4+ new acres of parkland plus an official SWC skateboard park coming soon. 2015 could be called "the year of public-private partnerships" because of the work of partnerships throughout the park, including the longstanding work of the SWCP Conservancy, Friends of Carleton Court Dog Park and the Community Garden Council and the newer work of the Greenway Extension and the SWC skateboard park.
